

Baseline Testing

- Your son/daughter has come to us with KS2 scores in Reading, Maths and Spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG).
- The scaled scores range between 80 and 120. The expected standard for each test is a scaled score of 100 or more.



We also carry out CATs, PASS and NGRT tests

CAT Tests (Cognitive Ability Tests)

- shapes and patterns (Non-Verbal Reasoning)
- words (Verbal Reasoning)
- numbers (Quantitative Reasoning)
- mentally generating and transforming visual images (Spatial Ability)
- **Standard Age Score**. Compare same month. Students who score exactly as expected for their age group would be given a score of 100 (scores between 89 111 are considered to be "average").



Scores of 112 and above are deemed above average and scores of 88 and below would be considered below average.

SAS scores will range from 69 to 141.

Setting

- We use official KS2 information and details from the Teacher Assessments to set students
- The expected standard for each KS2 test is a scaled score of 100-120. Greater depth is considered to be a score of **110-120**.
- Will review in light of CATs and NGRT; and also the professional judgement of your son/daughter's teachers – some movements at the end of term



Assessment

- Formative assessment is continual and takes many forms; Entry Tasks, oral contribution in class, quizzes, checking for understanding, knowledge checks, homework, tests...
- Effort is an important factor





How to use a knowledge organiser

- Step 5: With a different colour pen, write down any information you missed so you can visibly see any gaps in your knowledge



 - Homework





• On the behaviour screen you will be presented with informative graphs which display your child's overall behaviour in the form of a pie chart and a bar graph.











Behaviour score breakdown




- Homework tasks fall under 3 different categories:






Xpressions mobile app

 - Communicate directly to school (including notifying the school about absences


